







# Possible Careers in Applied Behavior Analysis:

**Counselors** in public schools, colleges, hospitals, clinics or residential programs, and who work with children, adults, individuals with disabilities, low-income families and people struggling with addictive behaviors.

**Psychological Assistants** working with licensed psychologists in research, counseling or clinical tasks.

**Special Education Behavioral Specialists** working in public schools, private schools or residential facilities.

**Board-Certified Independent Practitioners** working with individuals to identify behaviors, create behavior plans, manage assertive and crisis behaviors and conduct individual assessments.

**Clinical Behavior Analysts** working closely with clinical social workers to provide behavioral management services, interventions and management in education, health care and social work sectors.

**Organizational Behavior Management (OBM) Specialists** working as consultants or in human resources departments where they typically interact closely with management and decision-makers in the business to analyze and offer advice on improving employee performance and efficiency.

**Behavioral Coaches** working as consultants in sports and athletic programs to teach and reinforce skills used in training and competition. The principles of ABA are used to improve athlete training, enforce a healthy diet and regular exercise program, and to boost the performance of particular athletic skills, such as maintaining proper body form.

**Animal Behavior Consultants and Trainers** working with pets to improve the animal's behavior, and teaching owners how to maintain their pet's behavior over time.
