## Post-Professional Doctor of Physical Therapy

The Post-Professional Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program is a three-year, full-time program designed to prepare students for advanced clinical practice and leadership roles in the field of physical therapy. The program is accredited by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) and the Council on Accreditation of Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE). The curriculum includes coursework in advanced clinical practice, research, and leadership, as well as a clinical internship. The program is designed to be completed in three years, with a total of 120 credit hours. The program is a requirement for licensure as a physical therapist in many states.

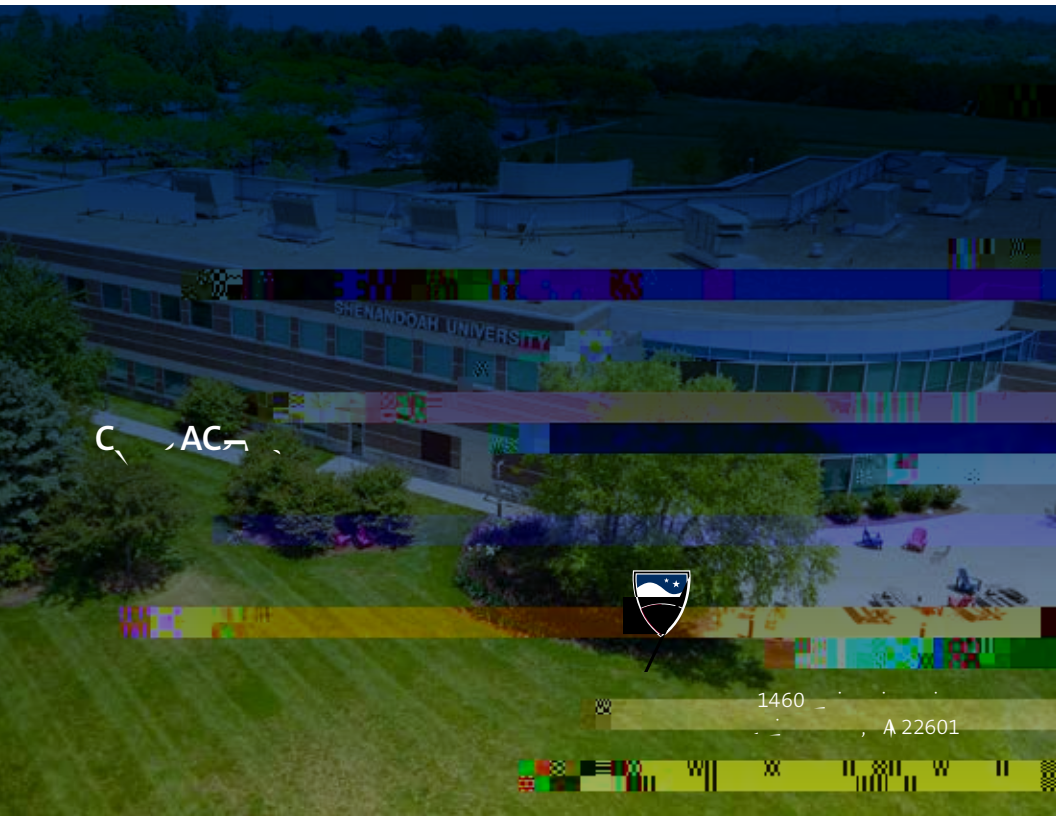
