Transfer Pathway

An undergraduate student at Shenandoah completes a bachelor's degree and applies to the graduate program(s) of their choice, typically during the third or fourth year of the undergraduate program. They follow the published graduate admissions guidelines and procedures.

Student Articulation Pathway

Articulation agreements are some of the best pathways for students. Our graduate Health Professions and Pharmacy schools have established articulation agreements with our undergraduate College of Arts & Sciences. These agreements provide a pathway into the graduate admission process by reserving a set number of seats in the graduate programs for students applying from within SU.

**For students interested in a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree, Shenandoah has an articulation agreement with the Edward Via College of Osteopathic Medicine that guarantees an admissions interview for Shenandoah students who meet certain requirements.*

Students Eligible: Articulation agreements are designed for applicants who have completed graduate prerequisites and will be obtaining a bachelor's degree from Shenandoah University and plan to move directly into respective graduate programs, and who are not planning a gap year.

Process: Any student currently enrolled at SU can apply to the graduate program. The graduate program will evaluate the applications from Shenandoah students individually, and as long as they meet graduate admission requirements and requirements specified in the respective articulation agreement, **students will be invited to interview for the graduate program.**

What major should I choose as a pre-health student?

All graduate health professions programs have a list of prerequisite courses that students are required to take in addition to the major courses. Many pre-health students major in biochemistry, biology, chemistry, exercise science, psychology or public health.

Can I enroll in a certificate program?

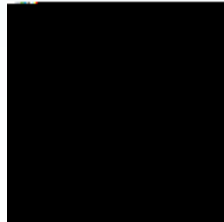
Yes! Students can enroll in a certificate program in addition to major/minor. Recommended certificates include Pre-Health Professional, Health Humanities and Population Health.
